Significant discussion about senate bill 467 re pelvic exam on unconscious patient needs informed consent. Doug Phelan has been researching and will discuss more with legislative round table

This is in line with ACOG policy

The committee initially opposed this bill and two large organizations spoke against this last year when this bill came up.

Discussion if we support this law.

1 New Section; Physicians and Surgeons; Certain Examination Prohibited. Amend RSA 329 by inserting after section 1-e the following new section:

329:1-f Pelvic Examination on Anesthetized or Unconscious Female Patient Prohibited. A physician, surgeon, nurse as defined in RSA 326-B:2, VII-a, or student undertaking a course of professional instruction or a clinical training program, shall not perform a pelvic examination on an anesthetized or unconscious female patient unless the patient gave informed consent to the pelvic examination, or the performance of a pelvic examination is within the scope of care for the surgical procedure or diagnostic examination to be performed on the patient or, in the case of an unconscious patient, the pelvic examination is required for diagnostic purposes.

Motion to support this bill as written Motion passed Doug will give us more information when it becomes available
