Guest presentation: NHPIP Holly Tutko, Pediatric Improvement Partnership, through UNH

Holly highlighted 3 projects:

- 1. Developmental evaluations- 7 practices across the state implemented ASQ (Ages and Stages Questionaire) testing
- 2. Oral health- 3 practices participating focusing on fluoride varnish application
- 3. Behavioral health- focusing on integrating behavioral health into the care team

Here to talk with us about: NH MCAP (Mental Health Care Access in Pediatrics). Project goal: build the capacity of NH pediatric primary care physicians to diagnose, treat, and provide on-going care management for children/youth with mental and/or behavioral health disorders. Explains this includes using distance-based technology to increase capacity. First year plans to address anxiety and depression. Looking for participants in Project ECHO to meet once per month for 10 months for about 1.5 hours per call. Would be asked to bring 1 case. Project ECHO uses a hub (subject matter experts) and spokes (providers) model with short didactic and then discuss cases. Sessions to begin winter 2020. Contact Holly to request more information.
